In 1876 Lucy also wrote: "I have for the last thirty six years resided with my son Francis Daniel Blennerhassett who has for eleven years last past carried on business at 13 Duke Street, Manchester Square, in the County of Midd'x, as an engraver" (but at the time of 1871 census she was with her son Alfred, at his home 16 Brook Street, London)

Lucy Cox's family(?)... Witnesses to the 1832 marriage of John Blenner hassett and Lucy Cox at Swindon Village Church were Mary Ann Cox & Charles Jones, the latter also a witness to m.

"Directory of London Photographers 1841-1908" compiled by Michael Pritchard 1986 lists him as a photographer at both addresses, under Hasset (in 1864-71) and under Blennerhassett (1872-75); he was still taking photographs professionally in 1894

Health Inspector for Clarkenwell, London; he manufactured nitrous gas for medical use, his family delivering it to the London hospitals

John Frederick B'hassett founded "Blennerhasset's West Central Organ Suudio/School" at 1A & 1B Vernon Street, Kings Cross Road. Clerkenwell/Pentonville, London 1870-1904;

here he designed organs and organ hydraulics; he manufactured Blennerhasset's patent Perfect' automatically governed Hydraulic Engines, which were fitted to his own and other organs

He sold organs and gave organ lessons, the building used as a music centre bef. "Trinity School of Music" was established: the building since demolished;

His advertising brochure states: "The Organ in the above

studio is of Three Complete Manuals, CC to G, 56 Notes, Pedals, CCC to F. 30 Notes. concave frame, College of Organists' scale. As originally designed by Mr. Blennerhasset in 1870." and "The Studio is on the groundfloor, in a private room where students or teachers may be practically as much 'at home' as in their own houses."

In 1891 his "Hydraulic Machine Maker" business was in adjacent premises at 1B Vernon Street, but in 1895 once again at 1A

POLICE. Mr CHARLES DOVE, 18, electrical engineer, of 22, Claremont-square, Islington, was charged before Mr.d'Eyncourt, with assaulting Mr.John Frederick Blennerhasset at the Inventions Exhibition, on the evening of the 18th inst. Mr.C.W.P.Overend was counsel for the defendant. The prosecutor, an hydraulic engineer, is an exhibitor in the Central Gallery Annexe of the Exhibition, and on the evening in question the defendant was in that part of the building making his way to the grounds. When a few paces from the door leading to the open he struck a match to light his cigar. Prosecutor told him that smoking was not allowed, and called his attention to a printed notice to that effect, at the same time blowing out the light. Defendant thereupon stepped out into the grounds, but returned immediately and lighted a second match. Mr.Blennerhasset went towards him again, and was struck a blow across the nose by the defendant with a heavy walking stick. He complained further that the defendant knelt on his chest, and dug his knuckles into his throat, occasioning him ntense pain. Several exhibitors were called in corroboration of the prosecutor's complaint, and for the defence Miss Jessie Brown, daughter of an organist exhibiting in the same annexe, deposed that the complainant spoke rudely to the defendant, endeavoured to wrench a match box from his hand, and that a struggle ensued, in which the prosecutor was worsted. Council for Mr.Dove asked the magistrate to regard the affair as a brawl, provoked by the complainant, who might, had he chosen, have called a constable when defendant was infringing the rules. Mr.d'Eyncourt said very properly stringent precautions were taken against fire. The complainant was a little excited, no doubt, but he was in the right. He fined the defendant £3, and £2 costs.

Some family historians have mistakenly identified this Ellen Blennerhassett b.c1840 Ireland (who m.13.2.1859 Francis Oliver Hale) with a different Ellen Blennerhassett who was bapt.1.9.1841 Marylebone, London, England (see page BCL 11, above)

This cannot be so, because:

- 1. Ellen Blennerhassett bapt.1.9.1841 Marylebone (BCL 11) was in 1861 still unmarried, living with her mother Lucy Blennerhassett (nee Cox) at Marylebone, London
- 2. Ellen Blennerhassett who m. Francis Oliver Hale (whose family is shown on this page BCL 15) was b.c1840 in Ireland, not in England
